
Minutes for the meeting of Moulsoe Parish Council held on

291	Ward Councillors' Update	<p><u>MK Council HIF Bid</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A decision was expected around Christmas time this has now been put back by a couple of months. There have been a large number of bid applications. <p><u>SERCO</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Waste collection was a disaster over the Christmas period • Vehicle breakdown was cited as one cause of service failure • Also vehicles are big enough for volume of Christmas Waste • Text messaging service for updates for residents no longer working • All deliveries are now back to normal <p><u>Budget</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • MK Council budget is out for consultation ending 31 January • Road show on 24 January Christ the Cornerstone <p><u>Neighbourhood Plan</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At development control beginning to see benefit of Neighbourhood Plans <p><u>5 Year Land Supply</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Still not resolved • Waiting for a response to an appeal <p><u>Village Visit 7 December</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Came out and assessed various issues along with Tom Blackburne-Maze, director of Public Realm and Sean Rooney, Head of Highways, the state of the fading road markings, drainage and any other road issues. • They have taken pictures of the area at the bottom of Newport Road and its junction with A509 and accepted there is a problem with the drainage. It has been logged on a list. <p><u>White Lines</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Whole borough is short on funding for white lining. Only for safety/accident would it be done in the short term. <p>There was then a general discussion regarding the state of the local roads.</p>

	Neighbourhood Plan	SW will continue to look in to this
	Cranfield Airparks	<p>A large amount of documentation has been delivered to the Parish Council, containing plans, reports and supporting documents regarding the development. Ward Councillors have not received anything from the developers, their response in principle would be that is good to see expansion and use of the airport but not at the expense of the residents in Moulsoe, North Crawley and Astwood.</p> <p>Council concern is that the village would get the fallout from the construction traffic, and all associated traffic. There is nothing in the documents relating to traffic management on the</p>

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		<p>Bucks side it's all focused on the Bedfordshire side.</p> <p>Parish Council feel construction traffic is a point that needs focussing on.</p> <p>KM that it is a valid comment to put to Brett Leahy that the provision for traffic management is focused on Bedfordshire and doesn't take into account where traffic will come from. Increased traffic will go across the border into MK via other routes. Could argue traffic should come from J13 to protect villages in MK.</p> <p>NR said the existing developments in Cranfield already putting huge amounts of construction traffic through the village. We should comment that construction traffic does not come through Moulsoe if application granted</p> <p>Possible weight limit needed to stop construction traffic.</p> <p>KM suggested putting forward our concerns as a Parish Council to MK Council Head of planning that as parish council we would hope that MK Council would have a duty to co-operate with Beds.</p> <p>COH queried if there was any mention of S106 money relating to this development. KM suggested directing that query to Brett Leahy at MKC and will it be directed to help improve infrastructure in MK to support the development.</p> <p>Moulsoe will be mostly affected by increase in traffic due to our location to J14.</p> <p>Construction traffic and ongoing HGV's is the primary concern that needs addressing. The state of the road would need to be looked at and repaired/replaced.</p>
	Settlement Boundary	Amended Plan sent only slight correction required
	Traffic and Roads	<p>Speed watch</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Now have all the data from the last year and condensed it, and produced a report showing trends. This will be sent to Kevin Parradine, Sean Rooney and police • Outcome is hopefully speed calming of some form • SW hoping that it will highlight what is happening with traffic through the village <p>There have been a number of accidents within the last 2 years in the village, cars in ditches and the incident with the bus most recently. They seem to occur in failing light, which could be as a result of the fading of the white lines marking the edge of the road.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sentinel Speed watch Kit – SW will get in contact with Bucks CC re trialling the kit <p>Discussion as to whether the Council should use S106 money to purchase a kit of our own and if it would make a difference to the speed of traffic. The only way to slow traffic is to have physical speed calming measures, i.e. speed bumps. Funding for physical speed calming is currently not available; they have their own issues, and are a huge cost.</p> <p>Further discussion centred on how drivers are dealt with using the Sentinel Video Kit. They are still only sent a letter as with the current community speed watch kit; a ticket will not be issued.</p>
	Play Area	<p>NC has been in contact with Phil Snell. The Play area has now been signed off. She will write up a report and Phil will be named as Lead Person and submit claim to WREN. SW has had so many comments as to how great the area is he will pass these on to NC for her report.</p> <p>SW thanked NC and ET for all their hard work.</p>
	Bus Shelter	<p>KH has again been in contact with Public Transport at MK Council. The recycled shelter is now not suitable for use. They are now proposing to install an aluminium MKC shelter. Parish Council stated that MKC took it down due to non maintenance so they expect a shelter to be replaced. KM asked that Ward Councillors to be copied in on emails regarding this and it was reasonable to expect a decision by the end of the month.</p>
293	Finance & Administration	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Bank balance £7012.02 and accounts as at 29 December were approved by SW. • Costs of £46 SLCC subscription for KH approved. • Precept – it was resolved to increase the precept as discussed

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295	AOB	<p>MK Forum - Discussion regarding membership, it was decided KH to check rates and report back to Council</p> <p>Hall Field - KH had an email from a hirer of the hall requesting permission to put 3 gazebos on the field for a birthday party. Council agreed that as long as they were domestic gazebos and not marquees then it would be acceptable. They are not to be put on the new play area surface and not beyond the goal posts. KH will also make the hirer aware that the play area is open to the village residents.</p> <p>Highways Agency - letter received regarding the next phase of Smart M1 J13- 16 KH will put information on website for residents</p> <p>Street Lights – some seem to flicker on and off, possibly due to sensors on the top being covered with debris.</p> <p>Drain Culverts - are blocked again outside some properties, drains were all cleaned back in the Autumn</p> <p>White Lines – discussion as to if the Parish Council should get some quotes to redo the white lines coming into the village, from possibly from A509 to 40mph from a safety point of view. Using some of S106 money to do so.</p> <p>Resignation - NC offered her resignation as councillor, she has reluctantly come to the decision due to her forthcoming house move. She will ensure all the relevant paperwork for the Play Area is complete before she leaves.</p> <p>SW thanked her for all her hard work for Moulsoe Parish Council. Council expressed their gratitude for all she has done and that her contribution to Moulsoe over the period of time she has been a councillor has been significant and valued and she would be missed.</p>
