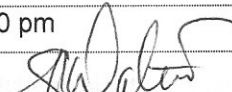

1.	Apologies	Peter Geary (PG); David Hoskings (DM); Keith McLean (KM)
2.	Disclosures of Interests	SW's employer hosts the domain for www.moulsoeparish.org. SW and his employer IDNet are providing improved broadband to Moulsoe.
3.	Minutes of the Last Meeting	Account balance was omitted on draft minutes, the minutes were amended. With the amendments the minutes of the meeting on 10 July were signed as a correct record by SW.
4.	Public's Representations	Rural Policing - In Mark Lancaster's recently published annual report it states Thames Valley Police have a £12.7 million funding boost. In light of the recent numerous rural thefts should there be lobbying for funding to increase rural policing. Recycling Sacks – these will no longer be available from local collection points, residents will have to order extra sacks online. Is it possible for the Parish council to order some and organise a time when residents could collect? If not freely available recycling will fall. Clerk will speak to the Waste and Recycling department. Broadband - there has been no further updates on when the village may have access to faster internet.
5.	Ward Councillors' Update	No Ward Councillors were present, but at the council meeting that had to be cancelled SW & NR had a conversation with Ward Councillors and notes from that discussion are attached to the minutes.
6.	Parish Council Business	
6.1	MK East Stakeholder Group	PG is chair of this group and SW along with a Councillor from Newport Pagnell is a vice chair. Group set up to liaise with those parishes with interest in the expansion of MK to the east. It's an opportunity to question MKC regarding the development to the east and get answers and raise objections. Workshops are being planned for people to get together and discuss what is wanted from any development. Council to let residents know of news via social media. Newport Town Council has asked to meet Moulsoe informally to discuss MK East. It is unknown what will be discussed; SW to contact Ward Councillors as it is felt one should be present.
6.2	Traffic & Roads	<u>ANPR</u> Several other parishes looking into obtaining ANPR cameras. Current information is that if funded by the community TVP take on the running of the cameras. Parish council will have no access to the data captured on the cameras. Costs are in the region of £3-4,000 for a single unit dual lane monitoring camera. Discussion as to whether this would be useful as opposed to single lane cameras at either end of the village. Council resolved to look into this further and options available with regards cameras and funding. S106 money could be used towards this, as well as purchasing a Speed Indication Device (SID) for Moulsoe. Currently deployment of SID is on a rota system with other villages. <u>Speed Watch</u> Discussion as to if a Speed Watch session could be combined with when the SID is in the village. This is a more reliable device than the unit usually used for Community Speed Watch. This would depend on availability of PCSOs who are already stretched over a wide rural area. Council to also look into costs of Sentinel device that also videos speeding motorists. Could ask Nissan at Cranfield if they would consider sponsoring costs. Police speed detection van has been in the village and has captured numerous vehicles over a short period of time exceeding the 30 mph speed limit.
6.3	Adoption of phone box	Phone box has now been adopted. Parish council now responsible for its upkeep. Council will clean the kiosk and look into updating the decals on the kiosk.
6.4	Play Area Repairs	Concerns still over the cracked wooden insects. MKC have stated they will keep an eye on the equipment and that it is guaranteed. Parish Council will conduct regular inspections themselves. Clerk to clarify with MKC the length and details of the guarantee.
