1	Welcome	Steve Waters welcomed all present													
2	Minutes of the Last Meeting	The minutes of the meeting on 8 May 2018 were signed as a correct record by SW.													
3	Annual Report from Chairman	<p>Steve Waters reported on what the Council had been working on over 2018-19</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Large part of Council business was dealing with the development of Mk East and Plan:MK and the public examination. Outcome not what the Council had hoped for and it brought forward the eastern development based on the HIF funding. Parish Council had worked with the Eastern Stakeholder group. And being involved did not mean there was support for the development, but an opportunity to know what was being discussed and putting our views across. HIF bid is currently with the Government and representations have been made to Mark Lancaster and the Ward Councillors. With their help council will continue to lobby the relevant parties. Localisation and devolvement of services – smaller councils may need to form syndicates to deal with contractors to provide services. Speeding and volume of traffic, volume of traffic can't be controlled but speeding can be managed. Speed watch deployments will continue, and funding is being sought to purchase the Sentinel video speed monitoring equipment. There could also be a benefit of 20mph speed limit through the village, this is being implemented in new residential areas of MK. Council is in contact with MK Council road safety team, the scheme has yet to be formalised by MK Council, but Moulsoe will be in discussions with MK Council. There will be a consultation with the village residents. We will continue to use SID speed devices, but new posts are needed. The current posts are in the wrong place or not safe for the devices to be put on. Road Safety at MK Council are aware of the issue. Neighbourhood Plan is still under discussion. Parish Council are aware of the cost and time to implement a plan and with Plan:MK due to be refreshed they will continue to assess when a Plan is needed for Moulsoe. <p>As outgoing Chairman thanks were given to the Clerk for efforts regarding the replacement bus shelter, the recent village clean up and completion of Audit</p> <p>The Chair also thanked fellow Councillors for their work over the last year and the Ward Councillors for their assistance and support.</p> <p>Vice Chair thanked Steve for all his hard work on behalf of the village and the Council.</p>

5	Public Questions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Street lighting – Changing the lights to LED lights were mentioned at a previous meeting but this has yet to be done in Moulsoe. Clerk will query this with Head of Highways Bin at Bus Stop – is very old and could do with updating. Clerk has been requesting an upgrade and will follow this up. Neighbourhood Watch – it has now been over a year since the Neighbourhood watch meeting and there has been no follow up with residents that signed up. Residents have tried to find out what the situation is but without success. Parish Council will make further enquires. Council have been given Neighbourhood Watch signs; these will be put up. Speeding – data from the SID devices deployed in March has been collated and the results do support the requirement for more monitoring and will help with funding applications for speed equipment. Over 11-day period 172 vehicles were logged as exceeding over 50 mph, and 13 over 60 mph.
